The Swedenborgian's say yes, and send 4 representatives.


Participants report how refreshing it was to be paired with partners from another denomination.

Her inspired action not only filled the gap for leadership temporarily, but also inspired other members to step up into leading worship service, both individually and in pairs.




#### Youtube video

# Community Storytelling

As a result of an inspired idea from the Innovation Laboratory, we are now in discussion with Virus Theatre Company about creating a Playback Theatre ministry.

Playback is a form of improvisational theatre that invites members of the audience to share a story from their lives. The story is then played back on the spot by members of the acting company.

The golden thread emerges as the audience sees how similar our stories are, community connections are strengthened, and the bridge of communication organically forms and builds from these sacred experiences.



# Follow up and Accountability

Group coaching has been offered for Innovation Lab participants to support the "bias toward action".

6 monthly check ins provide an opportunity for follow up and accountability. What has worked? What might we try differently? How can we support each other?
